

## Early Learning and Childcare: a guide for childminders

January 2016



**The Scottish Government** provides funding to allow three and four-year-old children to receive 600 hours of funded Early Learning and Childcare every year. Some families with two-year-old children also qualify to receive the funded Early Learning and Childcare. What is the eligibility criteria?

Early Learning and Childcare can be provided by; local council nursery, nursery class in a primary school, private day nursery, independent school nursery, playgroup or a **registered childminder**.

## **Childminders and Early Learning and Childcare**

Whether or not childminders are commissioned to provide funded Early Learning and Childcare is down to your local authority.

SCMA has gathered information on the use of childminders to deliver funded Early Learning and Childcare across the 32 local authority areas. The Act calls for delivery to be <u>flexible</u> and meet the needs of children and families. Our concern is that this is not happening across Scotland. The arrangements for delivery of this care vastly varies across each local authority; with childminders not considered as partner providers at all in some areas, to successful placements being arranged in others.

## What can a childminder do if the local authority won't contract with them?

Find out what's happening in your area. How does the local authority deliver funded Early Learning and Childcare? Is this provision flexible, as called for by the Act? Check on your local authority website. Information will probably be in the Education section of the website where you can also find a telephone number to find out more. Alternatively, check the Scottish Family Information Service website: <a href="mailto:scottishfamilies.gov.uk">scottishfamilies.gov.uk</a>.

Ask parents what they want. Do they want their child to be looked after in a nursery when you can provide consistent, high-quality care? Possibly not. Ask them to make their feelings clear to the local authority by writing to the local authority and their local councillor.

Write to your local authority, local councillor and MSP. Help them understand about the quality of your service and that your small ratio is often more suitable for 2 year olds. ## What is SCMA doing to help?

We have been gathering as much information as possible about the delivery of funded Early Learning and Childcare in each local authority. We continue to try and engage with local authorities on this issue however, in some areas, this is proving very difficult.

SCMA Chief Executive, Maggie Simpson, has met with the First Minister, the Minister for Children and Young People and other MSPs.

We have also engaged with Scottish Government, Education Scotland, the Care Inspectorate, ADES, Children in Scotland and various other organisations to keep them informed of the lack of progress in some areas.

A report produced by SCMA has been presented to the Scottish Government.

We will support any childminder who is willing to approach their local authority to question why they will not contract with childminders to deliver Early Learning and Childcare.
