

SCMA ELC Audit 2021 Childminder Survey

This snapshot survey represents the views of 464 childminders from 31 local authority areas. It was conducted from 26 August - 24 September 2021, in parallel to a similar snapshot survey of parents, to complement the SCMA Early Learning and Childcare Audit 2021.

The survey was designed to capture the views and experiences of childminders at different and distinct stages of the process in becoming involved in funded ELC, as blockages and delays within the process had been identified in earlier SCMA ELC Audits. To present a more rounded snapshot, it captures the experiences of:

- childminders who are currently involved in delivering funded ELC to families
- childminders who are approved by their local authority, but not yet involved in delivering funded ELC
- childminders who have applied but not yet been approved by their local authority
- childminders who are not involved in funded ELC









 the number of childminders involved in delivering funded ELC for the Scottish Government's priority group of eligibletwo year-olds (low-income families) remains very low.

of childminders reported delivering funded hours at a lower level as their main form of involvement.

The most common model of delivering funded ELC in which childminders are involved was reported as blended placements for three and four year olds. While some may also be delivering funded hours through other models, it is clear this is where the majority of childminders are involved in funded ELC delivery.

- significant delays continue between childminders being approved by local authorities to deliver funded ELC and them actually doing so. . 51% of childminders in this category have been waiting over 18 months since being approved and a further 26.7% have been waiting 12-18 months. Of those chose childminders experiencing delays, the majority (71.1%) believe the main reason for this local authorities not promoting childminding to parents equitably alongside nursery provision so they may be unaware it is an option).
- more widely, 63% of childminders currently delivering funded ELC believe local authorities have been very ineffective/ ineffective at promoting childminding equitably to parents as an option for receiving their funded ELC entitlement alongside their own nursery provision.

of childminders currently delivering funded ELC believe local authorities have been ineffective in promoting childminding equitably.

based on their experiences of supporting children and families, 52.3% of childminders involved
in delivering funded ELC believe families need much more/more flexibility in their future offers
of funded hours from local authorities. Further, almost 60% of childminders not involved in
funded ELC delivery believe much more/more flexibility is required and it is believed believe
that this lack of flexibility has led to some parents continuing to pay privately for childcare and
not taking up funded ELC.





while 67.2% of childminders involved at all stages of funded ELC believe delivering funded ELC is very important/important for their future business sustainability, fewer than I in 3 childminders involved in funded ELC believe there is a very strong/strong match between local authority offers to parents for their funded ELC entitlement and childminders' business needs and viability.

67% of childminders involved at all stages of ELC believe that it is important to their future business sustainability.

of childminders involved in delivering funded ELC reported an increase in paperwork.

• significant problems are being encountered due to the level of bureaucracy associated with ELC expansion, including excessive paperwork arising from duplicative quality assurance systems at a national and local level:

- → 86.3% of childminders involved in delivering funded ELC reported a significant increase/increase in paperwork;
- → 93.3% of childminders not involved in delivering funded ELC believed doing so would result in a significant increase/increase in paperwork; respondents also reported the level of bureaucracy and paperwork as the main factor (63%) in deciding not to become involved in funded ELC, despite 55% of those not involved reporting a loss of business and children from their settings due to not offering funded ELC;
- ightarrow only 57.3% of childminders involved in delivering funded ELC would recommend doing so to others.
- while some progress has been made in streamlining local authority tendering exercises for becoming a partner provider and delivering funded ELC, 40+% of childminders involved at different stages of funded ELC still found the tendering exercises and documentation very difficult/difficult;
- more encouragingly, 70% of childminders involved in delivering funded ELC to families believed that all of the children in their setting accessing funded ELC were the first choice of parents for accessing their funded ELC entitlement.
